# **RE: Signs and Symbols**

Our new topic 'Signs and Symbols' will enable the children to learn about the wonderful Sacrament of Baptism. On Wednesday the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, we visited St Mary's Church and looked at the Baptism Font and Paschal candle. Through Baptism someone becomes a member of the Christian family. Each Christian is entrusted with a special job – to be a friend of Jesus, and try to live as he would want. To lead the children into an understanding of the signs and symbols used in this Sacrament, the children have been learning about everyday signs that we see, and their purpose. A sign tells us something we need to know (e.g. road signs, house numbers, street names, sign posts).

**Home learning**: Talk to your child about their Baptism day and look through photographs that you may have of the day they were baptised.

## **English, PSHE, History and Geography**

The children are continuing their writing of biographies about their partner. They are editing their sentences to make them 'Golden', trying to add greater description and detail to make their writing more interesting and informative. They have also been adding conjunctions (and, so, but, because) to make their sentences more sophisticated. We will finalise the biographies by writing what their ambitions are and their hopes and dreams for the future and the world.
