# **RE Signs and Symbols**

Our new topic 'Signs and Symbols' will enable the children to learn about the wonderful sacrament of Baptism. Through Baptism someone becomes a member of the Christian family. Each Christian is entrusted with a special job – to be a friend of Jesus, and try to live as he would want. To lead the children into an understanding of the signs and symbols used in this Sacrament, the children will be learning about everyday signs that we see, and their purpose. A sign tells us something we need to know (e.g. road signs, house numbers, street names, sign posts).

## **English, PSHE, History and Geography**

## **Mathematics**

We have looked at the use of < (less than), > (greater than) to compare two number.

We have worked on Place Value and use of concrete objects, pictorial/ mental representation. We will introduce the resource 'Abacus' as an aid to teaching and learning about Place Value. We will be teaching the children to add or subtract ones from any 1- or 2-digit number, and then multiples of ten from any 2-digit number. We will be aiming for the children to be able to start working mentally, and to solve word problems.

**Home learning**: This week's learning the children can practise recording on an Abacus and partitioning numbers into Tens and Ones.

Please continue to encourage your child to count on or back in 10s, by using their 100 square to count down or up a column (95, 85, 75, 65, 55...).
