Dear Parents,

Following the cold weather, we experienced the 'stormy blast' this week. Thankfully the London area did not experience the worst of the weather, and there was only limited clearing up needed around the school building. It is a timely reminder to all of us about the unpredictability of the weather in winter and the importance of making sure all the children have warm clothing.

Public Health concerns

Many of you will have read and will be concerned about reporting in the media surrounding a range of infections that are potentially worrying for our children. There has been reporting of new cases of measles in the London area. We have noticed an increase in seasonal cold and coughs, some covid cases and flu. The flu cases are particularly unpleasant and have made some people extremely ill.

As always, vigilance is what is required from parents to spot symptoms and react accordingly. Quite a few illnesses have similar symptoms and are difficult to distinguish between. Health Advice for parents

<u>Coronavirus</u>

When using a test, check that it is a recent one that is set up to detect new strains of the virus.

Group A Strep (streptococci)

Scarlet fever is usually a mild illness, but it is highly infectious. Look out for symptoms in your child, which include a sore throat, headache, and fever, along with a fine, pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel. On darker skin the rash can be more difficult to detect visually but will have a sandpapery feel.
