Dear Parents,

Welcome back to school. I hope that all of you had a good rest together as families, and have marked the start of Lent together. This important season in the Church year has been the focus of our assembly and liturgy time this week.

Swimming Gala

We are delighted to report that our Swim Squad excelled at the Croydon Finals, which were held at Trinity School on Wednesday evening. Because of the dedication of the children and the skilled preparation from Miss Aherne, our children have had the opportunity to succeed in a very competitive environment. The children won fourteen medals in total.

Mobile telephones for children

Many of you will be aware that the Department for Education (DFE) have published guidance this month about the use of mobile phones by children, following consultation with education professionals. I am pleased to say that the guidelines issued are broadly similar to the routines that we have had in place for a number of years. Please remember that we *discourage* children using mobile phones on the journey to and from schools. Children who use phones in public are a target for thieves. I speak from personal experience: my fifteen-year-old son was assaulted and his phone taken three weeks ago.

Phones are not permitted for children in school: if parents are insistent that children carry them, phones must always be handed in on arrival. This has not changed. A useful way of remembering this is 'never used, seen or heard' whilst on the school site.

The following section of the DFE guidance is also of use to parents, as we have always asked you to support the school regarding our guidance:

"Parents have an important role in supporting the school's policy on prohibiting the use of mobile phones and should be encouraged to reinforce and discuss the policy at home as appropriate, including the risks associated with mobile phone use and the benefits of a mobile phone-free environment.

Where parents need to contact their child during the school day, they should be directed to the school office, where staff should be aware of the school's policy on relaying messages and facilitating contact."

I am aware that the last point has been ignored by parents recently, who wish to communicate with children quickly and use the child's phone as a convenience. Please only contact your child on site through the school office.

Parent / Teacher interviews

Health Advice for parents

Coronavirus

The World Health Organisation now considers the covid pandemic to not be a global health emergency. For advice and support if you suspect someone has covid, please visit:

When using a test, check that it is a recent one that is set up to detect new strains of the virus.

Group A Strep (streptococci)

Scarlet fever is usually a mild illness, but it is highly infectious. Look out for symptoms in your child, which include a sore throat, headache, and fever, along with a fine, pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel. On darker skin the rash can be more difficult to detect visually but will have a sandpapery feel. Children with these symptoms should not attend school.
