Welcome back to another exciting term about to take place in Reception. Firstly, we hope you had a wonderful and restful break. The Reception team is thrilled to welcome you all back as we continue on our learning journey.



Our topic for this term is 'Celebration'. Within this topic we are thinking about celebrations that happen within our community as well as the Church. Next week the children will be thinking about celebrations that are important to them and sharing this with their peers.

Communication, Language and Literacy



The children are in for a massive treat next week as they will be visited by a host of animals to help immerse their themselves in the 'Dear Zoo' topic book we have been focusing on. From this experience there will be a host of opportunities to dive into rich conversation as well as a lot of chances for writing with a focus on use of adjectives!

The children have continued carried on with their phonics learning, investigating ai, ee, igh and oa. The children have shown a great level of ability in the sounds they have been learning and are blending with growing confidence. When at home please encourage children to explore their phonics by continuing to read their reading books but also taking time to write short sentences such as 'It is a cat'.

In Maths, we have been exploring the numbers 1 through to 5 and the children have been learning to recognise the quantity of a numeral within their environment. This can be encouraged at home by exploring games using a dice. Next week the focus will be on learning about 1 more and 1 less within number 1-5. The children will be adding one more and taking one away from a set of objects.

<u>Home Learning:</u> Give your child a set of objects (cars, spoons, counters etc) and ask them to add one more, how many do they have now? Or ask them to take one away, how many do they have left?
