Next week, we will be continuing our new learning which is based around the 'Questioneers Series' of books by Andrea Beaty. The children will be exploring how to write labels and captions for a variety of objects. The books all encourage children to think about how things are made or how they work.
Home Learning: Ask your child to think about the building they live in. How was made? What tools and materials did the builders use? How long did it take?



We have begun a new topic this half term called 'Special People'. The children will explore their experiences of special people that they may meet in their community and they will learn about how communities need and value the range of skills that different people bring.

Home Learning: Talk to your child about the special people in their lives and why they are special to them. If possible, please could you bring a photograph of your child's special person to support them with their learning in class, for example, a special person from their family.



This week the children have been exploring numbers to 20 and thinking about how these numbers are made up from tens and ones. Next week, the children will expand on this learning by using a number line to explore the place value of numbers up to 20.

**Home Learning**: Please ask your child if they can compare numbers up to 20. For example, is 12 bigger or smaller than 15?

## Important Reminders:

During the Winter months when the weather is colder, please send your child into school with **labelled** warm clothing e.g. coats, scarves, gloves, hats etc.

We will continue our new learning based around our class text – Iggy Peck Architect. The children will be writing character descriptions of Iggy using adjectives to describe and conjunctions to join sentences. They will also be labelling parts of buildings and beginning to plan our own fact file

Home Learning: Ask your child to tell you about Iggy. What can they remember about him? How would they describe him to someone who doesn't know who he is?

**Home learning:** At Mass help your child look for the 'special people' in our Church community, for example Altar Servers, Readers Eucharistic Ministers etc. Are all the special people present during Mass? (E.g. cleaners, flower arrangers etc?).



Next week the children will continue to work with numbers up to 20 with a focus on ordering groups and numbers.

**Home Learning**: Please practise counting forwards and backwards to 20 with your child. Can they identify all the numbers 0-20?
