RE: Books


RE: Books

Due to the Music Festival, we had to change the date of when will visit the Polka Theatre which we had actually booked in November 2023! Next week, we will begin to write our own version of Tidy suing a Story Mountain to plan the story. A story mountain helps the children to plan a beginning, middle and end to a story and also include a build up and resolution.



DT: The children are designing their own book covers as the book Tidy has a lovely layered cover and are now designing the animal character that they will have in their story. The animal will have a moving part attached to a lever and pivot.

Home learning: **Spellings** – Please practise the graphemes 'igh; and 'ing' which we put onto Seesaw. This will help them to punctuate their sentences and practise their handwriting.

Maths: We are learning how to give change. In order to do this well, the children need to be secure in counting on in 2s, 5s, and 10s to 100 and counting backwards from 100 to 0. We then transfer this to counting on in 2 Pence, 5 Pence and 10 Pence.

St Francis will attend Mass on Monday 5th February at St Mary's Church at 10.00 am and you are welcome to this celebration of Thanksgiving.


English, PSHE, History, Geography, Art, DT



Topic: 'Tidy' by Emily Gravett.

We are drawing this topic to a close and will revisit it after our visit to the theatre.

This week we will do some short story writing using the story mountain model so that the children can practise their tenses, punctuation and grammar. Please encourage your children to articulate the words they speak and form the sentences correctly. This will filter into their writing.



Home learning: **Spellings** – Please practise the graphemes 'ck' and 'th' which we put onto Seesaw. Please encourage your child to write these words using the Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check method and copy all the sentences that we have written. This will help them to punctuate their sentences and practise their handwriting.

We test the children's spellings by giving them a dictation. We say a sentence with one of the spelling words and the children listen and write it down. There are many skills in this practise such as listening, internalising the sentence, spelling the pattern word, spelling common words, writing with speed and punctuating the sentences accurately. Thank you for completing the spellings and now maybe practise some dictation too. If you would like

Maths: We are beginning our next unit on Multiplication. We begin by looking at repeated addition and eventually mental methods by learning by heart the 2.5 and 10 times table. We cover arrays and solving problems. We would like the children to write the repeated addition calculation, draw a pictorial representation, and keep the running total to work out the answer.

e.g. 3 lots of
$$7 = 7 + 7 + 7 = 21$$

Home learning: Money and giving change We are completing for the time being, giving change. Please complete the sheet using the counting on method and then draw the coins that you would receive
