This week we have been sharing our new class text 'Paddington'. The children have begun to write descriptions of Paddington and will continue to explore Paddington Bear stories next week, reading about his adventures in London.

We will focus on writing setting descriptions using adjectives (describing words).

**At home:** Please can you listen to your child read at home and return their reading book every day. It is very important for your child to be using their phonic knowledge to sound out unfamiliar words.



Next week we will be learning about Judaism. The children will be finding out how Abraham really loved and trusted God. We will share the story of Moses leading his people out of Egypt towards God's Promised Land.

During the month of November, we will be remembering members of our family and friends who have died as well as those who have died in wars.

**At home:** Please help your child think about important leaders in their lives, such as yourselves, their teachers, Parish priests and their Head Teacher etc.



We are moving on to learning about 'fact families' using addition facts within 10. We will also look at number bonds to 10 and how we can do these systematically.

We will be continuing our learning around our new text 'Paddington'. The children will be creating their own story maps to plan an adventure for Paddington.

**At home:** Please can you listen to your child read at home and return their reading book every day. It is very important for your child to be using their phonic knowledge to sound out unfamiliar words.



We will be starting a new topic "Waiting". We will be learning that Advent is a time to especially appreciate the love in our lives, and how we prepare to celebrate love becoming a reality in the person of Jesus. At Christmas, Christians celebrate the gift of Jesus given by God, as a sign and expression of His love. Giving and receiving shows us that all life is given by God, and life is given meaning through the gift of Jesus.

**Home Learning:** Talk to your child about what it is like when they are waiting for something to arrive such as a parcel or a visitor. Ask them to describe some of their feelings — excitement, anxiety or happiness etc.



We will be practising adding together 2 numbers within 10 and we will then begin thinking about subtraction within 10.

At home: Please support your child to form the numerals 1-20 accurately and with the correct orientation. Help your child to practise adding two numbers together and writing this as a number sentence.

## **English**



The children will use their story maps to write their own Paddington story in their books. We will be thinking about how to form a sentence correctly using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. They will be encouraged to use exciting language to make their story more interesting.

## At home:

Ask your child if they can tell you about some of Paddington's adventures, encourage use of expression as they speak.

Please can you listen to your child read at home and return their reading book every day. It is very important for your child to be using their phonic knowledge to sound out unfamiliar words.



Next week we will continue with the topic 'Waiting' and we will be learning about the different aspects of an Advent Wreath. The children will be creating their own wreaths and learning what the evergreen circle and each candle represents. We will also think about how Mary felt when the Angel Gabriel told her she was going to be the mother of God's son Jesus.

**Home Learning:** As a family talk about how you can prepare for the birth of Jesus and how Advent gives you the opportunity to prepare your hearts and homes for this very special event.



We will be practising subtraction within 10, using part whole models and number sentences to represent the number facts. The children will also be exploring fact families building on our previous weeks' learning.

**English** 



Following on from our learning about the animals in our class text, we will be organising and matching information about the animals to create animal fact files before beginning to plan our own animal fact file.

**At home:** Ask your child to think about where some animals go during winter time when the weather gets cold. When do the animals come out again?

Please can you listen to your child read at home and return their reading book every day. It is very important for your child to be using their phonic knowledge to sound out unfamiliar words.



Next week, we will be thinking about all the events in the Christmas Story and how this is an important time in the religious calendar for Christians. We will be looking back at our learning during our 'Waiting' topic and completing a task to show what we have learnt.
