This week the children have taken home story books for you to share with them and from the end of next week they will be taking home a reading book which is at their phonic level for them to read to you.

Once the children have these books, please can you listen to your child read at home and return their reading book and reading record every day. It is very important for your child to be using their phonic knowledge to sound out unfamiliar words.



The children have begun to learn about their Class Saint this week and have started to write their own prayers to St Therese and St Bernadette. They will complete this next week before beginning to think about their families as part of our 'Families' topic.

We will be talking about who is in our family and drawing pictures of them.

Home Learning: Talk to your child about your family and how you look after each other.



Next week, we will be learning how to sort and count objects in different ways. We will sort physical objects and pictures, explaining the ways in which we have sorted them.

At home: ask your child to sort different objects in your home e.g. how fruit can be sorted in different ways such as; by colour, or grouped by type of fruit.

Next week we will be learning how families look after each other in their homes. We will also be reading Psalm 28 from the Bible and will learn it's meaning.

Home Learning: Talk to your child about your family and how you look after each other in your homes. Eg. We keep it clean by tidying up.



Next week, we will be learning how to recognise numerals as words, as well as practising how to count forwards from a given number. We will be doing practical activities to help support our learning.

At home: Please practise counting objects with your child up to ten. Can your child match the number to the written word eg. five and 5.

At home: Talk to your child about the different groups they belong to and what it means to you.



Next week, we will be learning how to compare groups of objects and numbers using the language of 'more than', 'fewer than' or 'the same as'.

At home: Please practise comparing groups of objects and encourage your children to use their mathematical language to compare which group has 'more', 'fewer' or 'the same'.
