As we draw our topic 'Beginnings' to a close, the children will be reflecting on prayer and what we have learned from the Psalms about God's loving care for us. Based on Psalm 139. The children have considered what it means to be a child of God who created us, knows us and loves us.

Home Learning: Say a prayer together about the wonder of your being. In this prayer the children can thank God for being there at their beginning and with them each day.

English, Geography and PSHE

A 'Golden' sentence is one that begins with a capital letter, ends with a full stop or question mark and has to make sense

We will also look at a famous Croydonian Samuel Coleridge -Taylor who lived many hundreds of years ago and was a famous Composer. There is now a large painting of him outside Centrale. We will also be learning about Cicely Mary Barker, and the children should be able to explain to you why she is famous and why the people of Croydon should be proud of her.

Here is a brief outline of the work we will be covering this coming week.



Our new topic 'Signs and Symbols' will enable the children to learn about the wonderful Sacrament of Baptism. On Wednesday the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, we will visit St Mary's Church and looked at the Baptism Font and Paschal candle as well as say a prayer to St Francis' patron Saint. Through Baptism, someone becomes a member of the Christian family. Each Christian is entrusted with a special job – to be a friend of Jesus, and try to live as he would want. To lead the children into an understanding of the signs and symbols used in this Sacrament, they will begin by learning about everyday signs that we see, and their purpose (e.g. road signs, house numbers, street names, sign posts.)

Home learning: As you walk around the area, record any signs you see on the sheet given.

English, Geography and PSHE

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

Please complete the online permission as we are unable to take your child without your consent.


