# YEAR 2 NEWSLETTER

**Dear parents/carers,**

Welcome back to our weekly Year 2 Class Newsletter. With this renewed energy, we continue our journey and as we are now in the Liturgical season of Lent, we look forward to new learning and revisiting what it means to make this journey towards Holy Week and the Tridium.



## Religious Education

As we are now in the season of Lent, the children have made a Lenten Promise. They reflect upon these to help them to become closer to Jesus as we journey through Lent, towards Easter.

### Home learning:

We have been learning about the Eucharist. Please could you notice the part of the Mass when the Priest consecrates the bread and wine and draw your children's attention to it. We have looked at The Last Supper and made a correlation between the Mass and the words that Jesus used at that special meal.



## Phonics

**The graphemes we are focussing on are 'ee' and 'er'**

**Home Learning:** To support your children, we encourage you to practise a little dictation with these words in a sentence as they are on the home learning sheets. This encourages the children to listen and build stamina to write quickly in order to keep up, and also to put the words in context with the correct punctuation.



## Literacy:

**The genre we are learning about this half term is 'Fairy Tales'**

St Francis are learning about Little Red Riding Hood' and St Martin about 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff.' This week we have been learning about the characteristics of Fairy tales and what is common to them.

## Maths

### **Multiplication;**

We have been drawing arrays to work out Multiplication calculations. While the children can do a lot of the Times tables off by heart, we teach them how to do this using arrays as it is a great method to be able to understand and use. This is especially true for trickier calculations and in problem solving which we are working towards next week.

By looking at these paintings, we are trying to look at tones and colours used to evoke feelings of the scenes.
